PROGRAMME OUTLINE

On this part-time masters level course, you'll have one year to complete two core units plus a Practice Credit Portfolio.

This involves 10 attendance days, including, a one-day Conference with international speakers at the University at the end of your programme, plus independent and practice-based study.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Experienced or newly appointed SENCOs:

- Qualified Teacher Status (QTS), (QTLS) or Early Years Teacher Status (EYTS)

Aspirant SENCOs:

- Qualified Teacher Status (QTS), (QTLS) or Early Years Teacher Status (EYTS)
- Evidence of appropriate experience and support from your school to undertake qualification
- Able to meet all NASENCO Learning Outcomes.

You'll submit two written assignments plus your Practice Credit Portfolio.

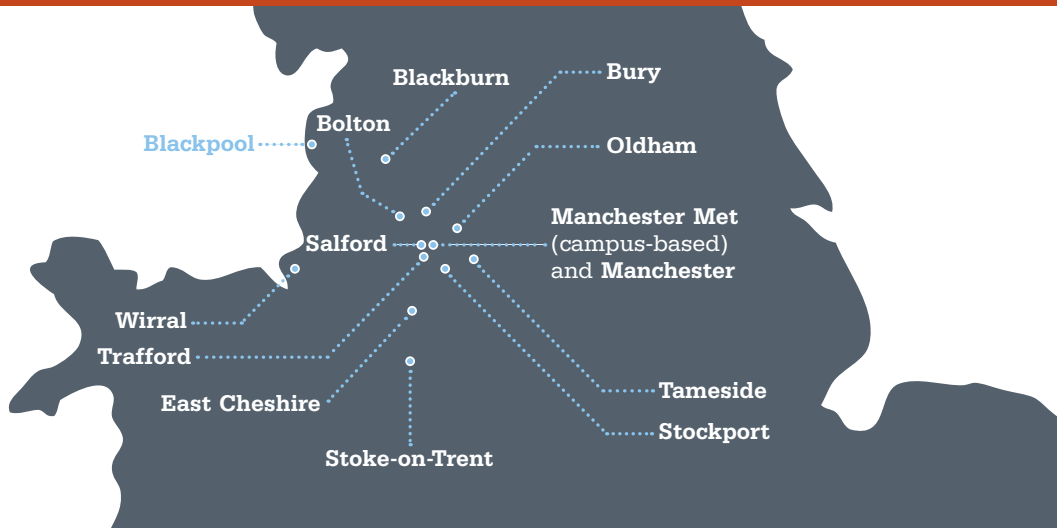
